1. Situation

a. General

(1) This is a I MEF order that has been coordinated with Marine Corps Installations West (MCIWEST). The purpose of this order is to establish and promulgate policy, procedures, and requirements for implementing the I MEF ATFP Program. I MEF and MCIWEST have developed an ATFP program directing threat awareness education, access control initiatives, and installation force protection posture. The goal of the I MEF and MCIWEST ATFP coordinated effort is to protect service members, DOD civilians, family members, contractors, facilities, and equipment in all locations and situations that fall under the cognizance of the I MEF and MCIWEST Commanding Generals. This program is designed to increase ATFP awareness within the I MEF community and address a variety of threats that can impact readiness, morale, health, and welfare.

(2) This order is applicable to all I MEF military personnel, DOD civilians, and contractors assigned, attached, in transit, or otherwise physically located on facilities/installations falling under the cognizance of the I MEF Commanding General.

b. Enemy

(1) Terrorist groups continue to pursue their traditional goals of generating publicity and instilling panic while developing new methods and capabilities of attack intended to achieve the greatest possible harm to people, infrastructure, key assets, and our way of life.

(2) Potential threats include terrorism, criminal acts, foreign intelligence, paramilitary forces, saboteurs, protest groups, and disaffected persons.

d. Assumptions

(1) Credible threats to the I MEF personnel, installations, equipment, and other assets are present for the foreseeable future.

(2) Collaboration with host installations, local, state, and federal agencies is required to address jurisdictional gaps for ATFP Program effectiveness.

(3) Implementation of ATFP mitigation efforts, such as Random Antiterrorism Measures, FPCON measures, and Guardian Angels will have to be balanced with resource constraints (both fiscal and personnel).

(4) The unpredictability and increasing sophistication of terrorist methods of attack may result in incidents occurring with little to no warning.

(5) Installation Military Police, both military and civilian, will be insufficient to provide total protection of all I MEF resources.

2. Mission. I MEF conducts ATFP operations to protect service members, DOD civilians, family members, contractors, facilities, and equipment in order to preserve and protect war fighting capacity and resources.

3. Execution

a. Commander's Intent. Commanders at every level must direct and promote Antiterrorism and Force Protection. All units will have a functional plan validated through exercise in order to maximize security and ensure appropriate measures are implemented to protect the force. The end-state of this program is the protection of I MEF personnel (military, civilians, and contractors), their families, and mission critical assets against all threats while maintaining continuity of operations.

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In meeting this goal, I MEF must observe the following objectives:

(1) Commanders will dissuade terrorists from planning against, targeting or attacking I MEF assets by vigilance and the use of tactical security at the individual and unit levels.

(2) Commanders will employ the appropriate mix of countermeasures, both active and passive, to prevent terrorists from attacking I MEF assets. The Guardian Angel concept will be the foundation of all I MEF actions.

b. Concept of Operations

(1) The cornerstone of the I MEF ATFP program is the alert, well trained, combat-ready Marine. The functional plans and measures that I MEF subordinate commands institute should be focused on building awareness and vigilance across the force.

(2) Synchronization of this multi-faceted program is primarily achieved through the coordination of the I MEF AT Officer (ATO) and the MCIWEST Mission Assurance (MA) Team. Efforts such as Eagle Eyes, Guardian Angels, and coordination with Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS) Agents will be managed through a monthly Threat Working Group (TWG) and a I MEF AT Working Group (ATWG) that meets quarterly. The TWG is comprised of I MEF, MCIWEST and NCIS representatives, while the ATWG includes the TWG members as well as representatives from all I MEF Major Subordinate Commands (MSCs). The output of these working groups will assist in sharing awareness across I MEF and MCIWEST and synchronize analysis and prevention efforts.

(3) The I MEF ATO and the MCIWEST MA Team shall be the points of coordination for all matters concerning ATFP issues.

c. Tasks

(1) I MEF AC/S G-2

(a) Participate in the I MEF/MCIWEST semi-monthly TWG and the quarterly ATWG.

(b) Augment NCIS with analytical capabilities.

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(c) Coordinate with the I MEF ATFP Officer on content of the weekly Ops/Intel brief.

(d) Coordinate with NCIS on Initial Intelligence Reporting (IIR) to the command.

(e) Be prepared to support I MEF troop movements, when resources are available, through the use of Counter Intelligence (CI). CI will conduct pre-movement route reconnaissance, local agency coordination, threat analysis; and route surveillance during movement in order to mitigate vulnerabilities and potential threats.

(2) I MEF AC/S G-3. Appoint in writing an ATO Level II trained ATO who will manage the I MEF ATFP program NLT 30 days after assignment.

(3) I MEF ATO

(a) Develop and manage the I MEF ATFP program.

(b) Lead the I MEF ATWG which meets at least once every quarter. The purpose of which will be to identify program shortfalls, identify training needs, and examine current FP technologies.

(c) Act as the Commanding General's principal advisor on all ATFP matters.

(d) Lead the I MEF/MCIWEST TWG which meets twice per month. The purpose of this group will be to track current threats, identify emergent threats, discuss mitigation factors, and track progress of ATFP initiatives.

(e) Ensure the timely and pertinent dissemination of AT threat information and intelligence, and implement effective AT risk management processes.

(f) Ensure that the Local Area Threat brief is updated quarterly and disseminated to the I MEF MSCs. This brief is given by the I MEF ATO during the quarterly ATWG.

(g) In accordance with the I MEF Mexico Travel Policy and the Combatant Commander's (COCOM) foreign travel

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policies, ensure personnel conducting foreign travel receive a country brief from G-2, a threat brief from the ATO, and have built and submitted an individual force protection plan (IFPP).

(h) Provide guidance concerning the arming of I MEF Area Guards and Duties in accordance with reference (w).

(i) Provide I MEF SWO with updated ATFP information daily for the read board.

(j) Coordinate with G-2 concerning counter intelligence (CI) vulnerability assessments and NCIS augmentation.

(k) Ensure continuous promotion of the "Eagle Eyes" suspicious activity reporting program.

(l) Review and update the I MEF ATFP TAC SOP, ATFP Order, and MOC Security SOP annually.

(m) In accordance with reference (x) disseminate and ensure MSCs are utilizing the I MEF Guardian Angel policy.

(n) Coordination with PPO Security Division (PS) and host the CRA sponsored ATO Level II Mobile Training Team courses.

(o) Coordinate with NCIS and MSCs to request Force Protection Response Group (PFRG) support for deployment of I MEF forces from CONUS.

(p) I MEF ATFP Officer will have daily interaction and coordination with MCIWEST, NCIS, and local law enforcement.

(q) I MEF ATFP Officer will review daily open source and other intelligence and threat reports.

(r) I MEF ATFP Officer shall develop local threat statements, criticality and vulnerability assessments, and physical security plans based on these assessments, per reference (l).

(4) I MEF MSC Commanders

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(a) Ensure the timely and pertinent dissemination of ATFP threat information and intelligence, and implement effective ATFP risk management processes.

(b) Ensure that the Local Area Threat is briefed to all personnel quarterly, or as required.

(c) In accordance with the I MEF Mexico Travel Policy and the COCOM's foreign travel policies ensure personnel conducting foreign travel receive the G-2/S-2 country brief and the ATFP threat brief for that country.

(d) Ensure continuous promotion of the "Eagle Eyes" suspicious activity reporting program.

(e) In accordance with reference (l), Marine Corps Physical Security Program Manual, ensure the subordinate Command's Physical Security Plans are appropriate for local Force Protection concerns.

(f) In accordance with reference (k), review and update their ATFP TAC SOPs, ATFP Orders, and Physical Security Plans annually.

(g) In accordance with reference (w), ensure duties at battalion/squadron level or higher are properly trained and armed.

(h) In accordance with reference (x), disseminate and ensure subordinate commands are implementing the I MEF Guardian Angel policy.

(i) Coordinate with Area Commanders and implement and manage the unit's RAM program in order to deter, detect, and defeat individuals or groups who pose a threat to I MEF and MCIWEST personnel, facilities and equipment.

(5) Security Augmentation Force

(a) Publish a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) or Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) that provides information for I MEF unit augments in support of MCB Camp Pendleton SAF during heightened FPCON. I MEF units that reside aboard other installations will comply with their current MOUs or MOAs with their host installations.

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(b) Coordinate with MCB Camp Pendleton in order to provide augmentation to the SAF for employment by MCB Camp Pendleton PMO in response to elevated FPCON. Identify the number of Marines needed per FPCON level, the training requirements for the augmentees, the equipment and weapons needed, who maintains availability roster, and point of contact for mustering times and locations.

(c) In accordance with reference (k), establish an Antiterrorism Information and Awareness Program to ensure all assigned personnel (military, civilian, and contractors) are aware of the general terrorist threat, the protection measures that could mitigate that threat, and make the CJCS 5260 and other handouts available.

(d) In accordance with reference (d), ensure that every Marine assigned to I MEF attends Antiterrorism Level I training. This training will be either given by the command's ATO, who is ATO Level II trained, or conducted online at <http://www.at-awareness.org>. This training is an annual requirement for all I MEF Marines.

d. Coordinating Instructions

(1) MCIWEST's Installation Commanders retain authority to change FPCONs without prior notification to MCIWEST or I MEF in extreme situations. MCIWEST will notify I MEF upon any installation FPCON change and coordinate with I MEF in order to execute ATFP operations in support of any FPCON change. MCIWEST will make every effort to coordinate region-wide FPCON changes with I MEF prior to implementation.

(2) An MOU or MOA between I MEF commanders and their host installation commanders will be published to facilitate execution of the I MEF ATFP Program.

(3) Request NCIS

(a) Provide intelligence and link analysis of threat trends within the I MEF and MCIWEST areas of responsibility.

(b) Provide local and national threat updates to I MEF and MCIWEST CGs and ATFP/MA teams.

4. Administration and Logistics. The I MEF and MCIWEST ATFP programs are managed by the I MEF ATO and MCIWEST MA Team

respectively. Guidance for ATRP support planning and operations is available in applicable orders and directives. Unforeseen issues involving the implementation of AT measures will be clearly documented and forwarded through command channels for resolution.

5. Command and Signal

a. Command

(1) Command Relationships. MCIWEST is the supported command and I MEF is the supporting command.

(2) Existing peacetime and contingency command and control structures apply during AT planning, coordination, and operations.

(3) Command Operations. The points of contact are the I MEF ATO at commercial 760-763-6596, DSN 361-6596 and the MCIWEST MA ATO at commercial 760-763-7533, DSN 361-7533.

(4) This order is applicable to all I MEF Marines, Sailors, DOD civilians, family members, and contract personnel.
